Crime/Incident Breakdown

MULGRAVE GGN

05/06/22- Violence- Low Whins Farm Staithes

Reportee states that dogs barked, snapped and bit him whilst he was walking through a public right of way through the farm yard. Police attended and there were many signs advising walkers to phone if access was required so that dogs could be removed. No further action.

07/06/22- Fraud- Staithes

Action Fraud report stated female in Staithes has lost a significant amount of money in a nationwide investment fraud scheme. Action Fraud are investigating.

10/06/22- Burglary - Borrowby

Victim reports a quad bike being stolen in the early hours of the morning. The quad bike was later found the next day in the Boulby area and returned to owner. Target hardening and security advice given, patrols increased.

15/06/22- RTC Damage Only- Scaling Dam

15/06/22- Police Generated - Newholme

Officers came across an abandoned vehicle which turned out to be a vehicle stolen from the Saltburn area in January. Vehicle was recovered for CSI and owners informed.

16/06/22 - Road Related Offence- Scaling Dam

One driver stopped and ticketed for speeding.

17/06/22- RTC Damage Only- East Row Car Park Sandsend

17/06/22- Suspicious Circumstances- Goldsborough Lane

Member of the public reports that a car is parked very close to the cliff edge on the Cinder Track, appearing to be stuck. On attendance female was arrested for drink driving.

19/06/22- Violence- Staithes

Landlord of a pub in Staithes reports that he has had to force a group of people out of the pub due to punches being thrown. Landlord knew the offenders and just wanted the incident logging in case of any future incidents.

21/06/22 - RTC Minor- Scaling Dam

24/06/22- Theft- Scaling Dam

Victim reports that a vehicle has made off without payment of fuel, however believed to be a genuine mistake. Fuel has since been paid for and no further action was wanted.

25/06/22- Stolen Motor Vehicle- Staithes

Victim reports their car being stolen off the driveway. Car was tracked to Cleveland and later found in Middlesbrough. Under investigation.

29/06/22- Violence- Staithes

Victim reports that he has been threatened and assaulted by his landlord. Suspect was arrested and released under conditions whilst this is under investigation.

04/06/22 - Drugs- Commondale

Member of the public reports large number of plastic bags containing cannabis and paraphernalia believed to be from a cannabis grow. Items were disposed of- no lines of enquiry.

05/06/22- Suspicious Circumstances- Castleton

Reports that there is a male trying van door handles. Area search negative gain.

08/06/22- Theft- Castleton

Theft of alcohol from a shop in Castleton. Suspect identified on CCTV, enquiries ongoing.

17/06/22- Suspicious Circumstances- Ainthorpe

Member of the public came across a motorbike abandoned in the road and believed it had been stolen. Owner of bike was found, did not want to make a complaint.

19/06/22- Stolen Motor Vehicle- Lealholm

Theft of a quad bike from a farm in Lealholm. The quad bike was later recovered from the Cleveland area. Target hardening advice given and patrols increased.

03/06/22-RTC Damage - Sneaton

04/06/22- Arson - Goathland

Reports of a cabin worth £8000 being set on fire, resulting in it being destroyed. Investigation ongoing with fire and rescue to determine lines of enquiry.

18/06/22- RTC Minor Injury - Ugglebarnby

19/06/22- Criminal Damage- Goathland

Reports that play equipment at the village hall has been damaged by someone drawing and writing on it in marker pen. No lines of enquiry.

20/06/22- ASB Nuisance- Sleights

Reports that a male has thrown a television out of his house and was shouting and screaming in the street. Male was arrested.

25/06/22- Stolen Motor Vehicle- Egton

Theft of a quad bike from a garage after the garage was broken in to. Quad bike was later found in the Cleveland area. Enquiries ongoing to identify the suspect.

29/06/22- RTC Damage Only- Glaisdale

There have also been four domestic incidents.

FYLINGDALES GGI

03/06/22 - RTC Minor Injury - Stainsacre Lane

03/06/22- Criminal Damage - Fylingthorpe

Reports of vandalism at the cricket club with windows broken and attempts to gain entry, believed to have been done by youths. No lines of enquiry but patrols increased.

07/06/22- RTC Damage Only- Stainsacre Lane

08/06/22- Autocrime- Fylingdales

Victim reports that their vehicle has been tampered with – the tyres had been let down and the number plate was broken. No lines of enquiry.

15/06/22- Burglary - Golden Grove

Victim reports a break in at converted barn resulting in items missing and damage to the front door and windows. Under investigation.

Victim reports items of £3000 in value stolen from an unlocked garage. No lines of enquiry.

18/06/22- RTC Minor - Robin Hoods Bay

Vehicle failed to stop, under investigation.

18/06/22- Theft- Hawsker

Victim reports that some iron guttering and roof tiles have been stolen from the side of their garage. No lines of enquiry.

20/06/22- Theft- Robin Hoods Bay

Victim reports their wallet containing cards and £230 in cash was stolen whilst in a café. CCTV captures the incident, enquiries ongoing.

20/06/22- Violence- Hawsker

Reports of an elderly male being assaulted at the side of the road due to a road rage incident. Dash cam footage and CCTV capture the incident, enquiries ongoing.

26/06/22- Burglary- Robin Hoods Bay

Reports of a break in at the tennis club in a believed attempt to take money from the honesty box. Glass was smashed allowing for forensic opportunities, enquiries ongoing.

There have also been three domestic incidents with two arrests.
